Police Accreditation



Construction Projects



The Secaucus Municipal Building is quite a bustling place on most days with residents and the public stopping by for permits and licenses, to pay taxes, visit the Municipal Court, or just to say hello to Mayor Mike. Located in Town Hall and the Annex are 20 Town departments. The buildings house over 100 full time employees in addition to our police force, parking enforcement officers and part time employees.

In recent weeks, you may have noticed that the streets around the area, including John Street and Post Place, have been receiving much needed upgrades to pavement and sidewalks. These are the final two streets for the 2018 Road Project undertaken by the Mayor and Council and managed by the Engineering Department. In total, six streets this year around Town have been reconstructed and received new curbs and sidewalks. Since the winter chill is in the air, the road program will start again in the spring as we continue to focus on our infrastructure
