The Mayor's Corner

The Town Council, Environmental Department and I thank residents for everything they do to reduce, reuse and recycle. The Town is working to make it easier for you to be environmentally responsible.

We recently launched the very helpful RecycleCoach app. Simply download the App to your phone, search for an item and it will provide disposal instructions customized for our Town. Please rinse items before you put them in the recycling bin.

We also provide ways to recycle items that are not accepted in our regular recycling bins. We have Green Boxes where you can drop off batteries and small electronics as well as specially marked bins for plastic bags and wraps, so they don't end up in landfills and waterways. Both are conveniently located at Town Hall, the Library, Recreation Center and other areas. We are also working on an ordinance to ban plastic bags to join

more than 30 communities that have already done it in New Jersey. We will give out free reusable bags and reusable straws at Town events to help residents use fewer single-use plastic bags and straws.

This year, we purchased more than 200 recycling bins through the Recycling Tonnage Grant for Clarendon and Huber Street schools. Additionally, our "rocket composter" helps the Middle and High School limit food waste which eventually winds up in landfills. Lastly, we are exploring ways to work with the County to extend food waste recycling to residents and businesses.

Town Museum Celebrates First Anniversary

Curious residents of all ages visited the Town Museum at 150 Plaza Center on July 13th to celebrate its first anniversary. Last July, after months of collecting, planning and organizing, the Museum opened its doors to the public. A fascinating look into the history of Laurel Hill, news articles from the early 1900s, artifacts from Mayor Paul Amico and other residents, portraits of past mayors and servicemen, the entire collection of the Home News, items graciously donated by longtime residents and more are on display. The collections and displays are constantly growing, so make sure you visit the Town Museum even if you already visited. There is always something new to see.



The Museum is conveniently located across the Plaza Shopping Center and is open on Wednesdays from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Special summer hours are Thursdays 4:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. Admission is free. Tips from the Department of Health

The Department of Health would like to remind all residents to:

- Place garbage and recycling curbside no earlier than 6:00 p.m. the day before collection day. If your garbage is collected Monday/Thursday, your recycling day is Thursday. If your garbage is collected Tuesday/Friday, your recycling day is Tuesday.
- Maintain outdoor pools and cut high grass on property to avoid tick and mosquito breeding.
- Register your cat or dog with the Department of Health. Registration is open year-round. Complimentary Rabies Vaccination Vouchers are available upon request. If you are aware of an unregistered pet, please direct them to the Department of Health at 20 Centre Avenue.

In interest of public safety, The Department of Health also inspects local businesses and temporary vendors at events and festivities. If you have any questions or concerns regarding public health, animal control and property maintenance, please feel free to call the Department of Health at 201-330-2031.

Affordable Housing Rehabilitation Program

The Town of Secaucus committed, through its Housing Department, to rehabilitate 42 units for qualified residents. Here's a program summary:

- A qualified applicant can receive a maximum of \$15,000 per unit for replacement of major systems in their home, i.e. heating system, roof, electrical, etc.
- Available for owner-occupied and investor units (tenant occupied).
- Funds received will be secured by a mortgage that is forgiven at a rate of 10% per year and totally forgiven after 10 years, provided the unit continues to be occupied by an eligible program occupant.

A Rehabilitation Program Manual has been adopted and provides all guidelines for participation. The application procedure stipulated in the Program Manual will be strictly followed. Applications and the Program Manual are available at the Secaucus Housing Authority or at the Mayor's Office. It is a limited program so apply as soon as possible.
