

Secaucus High School Students Shine at Hackathon

Two Secaucus High School 10th graders participating in SimpliHacks, a two-day virtual

hackathon for school students, won first place and the Wolfram Alpha Award. Aayush Agarwal and Krushay Bhavsar created a translator webapp named Signslate (short of Sign Language Translator) which aims at teaching American Sign Language as well as helping people with or without hearing and speaking disabilities. The win lands them a final round interview for internships at Y Combinator, Stanford University and Carnegie Mellon University startups.



Aayush and Krushay created the webapp in 20 straight hours of coding using machine learning and web scraping tools. The English to ASL translator allows a person to simply talk into their computer's microphone, and the website will translate it into ASL and display the sign language video. In addition, the webapp also uses artificial intelligence technology to translate from Sign Language to Text to Voice. This two-way translation allows meaningful conversation between people with and without hearing or speaking disabilities. It can effectively be the Google meet for people with and without hearing or speaking disabilities.

"Everyone knows there is a need to connect people with varying abilities. When we looked for solutions, we found there is not much out there that connects people with speech and hearing disabilities. That's why we decided to create this app. It is a real solution to a very real issue," said Krushay Bhavsar.

Ayush Agarwal summarized his rollercoaster of emotions on the day the winners were announced. "We did not expect to win at all. They first announced the third-place winner, then the second. When they announced the first-place winner, we could not believe it. We were beyond excited."

Ayush and Krushay are part of the newly formed Robotics Club which, under the guidance of Club Advisor Ms. Capobianco, is making its presence felt on the national scene. Earlier this year, the Club won a national robotics competition organized by Botball.

Affordable Housing Rehabilitation Program

The Town of Secaucus committed, through its Housing Department, to rehabilitate 42 units for qualified residents. Here's a program summary:

- A qualified applicant can receive a maximum of \$15,000 per unit for replacement of major systems in their home, i.e. heating system, roof, electrical, etc.
- Available for owner-occupied and investor units (tenant occupied).
- Funds received will be secured by a mortgage that is forgiven at a rate of 10% per year and totally forgiven after 10 years, provided the unit continues to be occupied by an eligible program occupant.
- Current income limits:

• 1 person: \$58,277

• 2 persons: \$66,602

• 3 persons: \$74,928

• 4 persons: \$83,253

• 5 persons: \$89,913

• 6 persons: \$96,573

A Rehabilitation Program Manual has been adopted and provides all guidelines for participation. The application procedure stipulated in the Program Manual will be strictly followed. Applications and the Program Manual are available at the Secaucus Housing Authority or at the Mayor's Office. It is a limited program so apply as soon as possible. Property Tax Due Date Extended

The deadline to pay 2021 3rd quarter property taxes has been extended to September 1, 2021. Any payments received after that date will be subject to a penalty dating back to the original due date of August 1st. Postmark is not considered as proof of timely payment. Major Upgrades Underway at Laurel Hill Park

Laurel Hill Park in Secaucus has grown from a not-so-used park to a well-outfitted, busy park in recent years. Residents already enjoy full sized fields for soccer, baseball and cricket, a boat launch, canoe and kayak rentals, boating tours, children's playgrounds, fishing pier, dog park and wellmaintained walking/bike trails. The park also offers amazing sunset views across the Hackensack. Tom DeGise, Hudson County Executive, announced that park improvement work has already begun, and exciting new upgrades are coming to Laurel Hill County Park soon. The additions and upgrades will transform Laurel Hill Park, the largest park in Secaucus, into Hudson County's premier park.

The planned upgrades include six new tennis courts, two volleyball courts, two basketball courts, a new parking lot with 50 more spaces and a new playground with aquatic features. The bike/walkway system, parking lots, existing playground, landscaping, gazebo, boat/kayak launch and shoreline will Location 145 Front St. be refurbished and/or restored. Each year the Secaucus Coalition and its youth wing, KAI, organize a Sticker Shock campaign; an awareness effort that reminds liquor buyers that it is illegal to buy or provide alcohol to minors. This year, current and former KAI members participated in the event held on June 28th. Participants placed neon green labels on beer cases at local stores including Krauser's, The Wine Outlet and USA Wine Traders Club. "We are happy to be part of such an important campaign," said Manager Veronica Cole of

The Wine Outlet. It is estimated that in just two weeks after placing the stickers, about 4000 impressions were made on customers entering the stores. Later in the day, the participants took a tour of and got an art lesson "How to Draw Spider Man", at the Kubert School, which offers

programs in cartoon-graphics/sequential art.


