NB Earth Talks Plants Trees in Town

The Town of Secaucus is committed to increasing tree cover in Town and has proudly participated in the Tree City USA program since 1993. Our Town's tree cover is below the ideal level of 30% to 40%, so the Town Council and Shade Tree Committee continue

to raise funds and plant trees to reach the ideal goal. Several individuals and businesses have made generous contributions to the effort. Recently, NB Earth Talks, an organization founded earlier this year that works towards environmental justice, also contributed to this



effort. On October 18th, they joined Mayor Gonnelli, members of the Town Council and the Environmental Department to plant six trees on the island on west-bound Route 3.

Students Love Walk with a Cop Program

Residents may have noticed a lot of happy students being escorted to school by police officers. What was that about? It was a continuation of the Secaucus Police Department's community policing strategy—this one is the "Walk with a Cop" program where students of Clarendon and Huber Elementary schools were invited to walk to school in the company of police officers. The program was intended to make officers more approachable to school children and improve police-community relations. It was also an opportunity for officers to share pedestrian and traffic safety tips. The program saw robust participation by Clarendon School students on October 15th and Huber School students on October 22nd. Students were led by Police Chief Dennis Miller and several other officers. Therapy Dog Oakley made the occasion even more special as he welcomed hugs from eager students.



Residents Upcycle Through GreenDrop

The Town of Secaucus officially partners with GreenDrop LLC to offer residents an opportunity to drop-off unwanted, donate-able items at least twice per year in conjunction with our popular town-wide garage sales. This partnership is promoted to residents to give their household items a second chance and in doing so, they can reduce landfill waste while also helping raise critical funds for charity. GreenDrop works on behalf of charities including the American Red Cross, the Military Order of the Purple Heart, and the National Federation of the Blind.

The effort has been a success! On October 2nd, residents dropped off 148 bags/boxes after the Fall Town-wide Garage Sale. Earlier, Secaucus residents dropped off 62 bags/boxes at the Green Fest, and 240 bags/boxes after the Spring Town-wide Garage Sale. That's an impressive 450 bags/boxes this year! Secaucus will continue to partner with GreenDrop for all future town-wide garage sales. All GreenDrop event flyers are regularly posted at municipal buildings, on the Town's Facebook page, Town website, community calendar, and in the Secaucus Newsletter. Larger furniture and other items not accepted by GreenDrop can be donated locally year-round by using instructions provided on the Town's Recycle Coach App within the "What Goes Where" search tool. Volunteer Group Asez Wao Cleans Up Park Plaza Drive

On October 3rd, Asez Wao, an international young adult volunteer group participated in a massive clean-up drive in the Park Plaza Drive area. Anyone who has been in the area is aware of the floating plastic bags, soda cans, paper and other kinds of trash that is littered in the area, often getting trapped behind the wire fence. This area is particularly environmentally sensitive as pieces of trash not only pollute local land parcels but also potentially end up in the waterways. More than 80 volunteers participated in the effort and collected 130 bags of trash. "This was a much-needed effort and I thank Asez Wao for volunteering their time. We were pleasantly surprised with the number of Asez Wao volunteers that came out to help, but what was even more impressive is that each one worked wholeheartedly and with a purpose," said Mayor Michael Gonnelli. The Asez Wao team was formally honored at the October 13th Town Council Meeting. Mayor Michael Gonnelli and the Town Council presented a Proclamation to the volunteer team to thank them for this effort.


Knights of Columbus and Town Pay Tribute to Veterans
