### **Councilmembers Sworn in for New Term**

Three members of the Secaucus Town Council were sworn in for a new four-year term at a meeting held on January 3rd, 2023. All three councilmembers ran unopposed in the November 2022 election. Judge Karen Boylan administered the oath of office to John Gerbasio of Ward 1, James Clancy of Ward 2 and Orietta Tringali of Ward 3.

# Mayor's Corner

I write this with a heart filled with gratitude and pride for our community that comes together in adversity, as it does in times of joy.

Around midnight of January 15th, the Secaucus Fire Department responded to a fire alarm at 220 Meadow Lane. Fire and Police Departments responded swiftly but what started as a fire in a single unit, sadly ended with one fatality, and 11 families being displaced. Most of the apartments involved were affected by smoke, not by fire, thanks to the response of our Fire Department. It has been a terrible ordeal for the families affected; I pray they can get their lives back on track again soon. We are here to support them every step of the way.

Members of the Town Council and I have been available, answering questions and providing assistance to the affected families since the fire. Representatives of the Red Cross also met with each of the families to help with alternate living arrangements and more. On Saturday, January 21st, members of the VFW hosted a fundraiser led by the Secaucus Emergency Fund with a goal of raising funds to help those impacted by the fire. As soon as the fundraiser was announced, pledges started pouring in from local non-profit organizations, businesses, and individuals. During the 4-hour drive,

Town Council members and I joined the Secaucus Emergency Fund team on Paterson Plank Road and in the Plaza Center, waving to residents as they stopped their cars and poured in the donations. In all, the effort raised more than \$35,000, far more than any of us anticipated. The donations speak volumes about our

caring community, and about the generous spirit that binds us together. I am not able to list everyone who donated, but I thank everyone for their contributions, big and small. I am glad to say that 100% of the donated funds were distributed to displaced families--the Secaucus Emergency Fund presented checks at the Town Council Meeting on January 24th and we hope this helps families as they navigate towards normalcy.

My faith that Secaucus is the best place to live gets affirmed, repeatedly when I experience such caring and generosity. Thank you for making it possible.

### ANCHOR Program Deadline Extended

The deadline to apply for ANCHOR program benefits has been extended to February 28, 2023! The program provides property tax relief to residents who owned or rented their principal residence in New Jersey on October 1, 2019 and met income requirements.

Homeowners need an ANCHOR ID and PIN to apply online or by phone. If you did not receive a mailer or email with an ID and PIN, but filed a Homestead Benefit application last year can retrieve the ID and PIN online. Certain homeowners must file a paper application.

All eligible renters/tenants can apply online or complete a paper application, and do not need an ID or PIN.

# Pitching In to Make a Difference

On January 15th, an apartment complex on Meadow Lane was affected by a fire resulting in one fatality and displacing 11 families from their homes. Mayor Mike Gonnelli and the Town

Council, along with the Secaucus Emergency Fund and volunteers, collected donations during a fund-raising drive on January 21st. VFW Post Commander Phil Papa, Councilman Bill McKeever, and other members of the Secaucus VFW donated the use of their facility, where the volunteers and residents were served food and beverages. The Secaucus Fire Department, Police Department, PBA, K&S, local businesses, organizations and residents together pitched



in, and the drive raised more than \$35,000 at the time this report was written. Checks were presented to the families at the Town Council meeting on January 24th. A \$500 voucher from Bob's Discount furniture will also be sent to each family.

The town provided temporary housing for the families at a local hotel until they can return to their homes.

# New Fire Department Officers Sworn In

The Fire Department has a leadership rotation every two years. At the January 3rd Town Council meeting, new incoming officers were sworn in: Fred Schneider of Tower 2 as Fire Chief, Lawrence Marciano of Washington Hook and Ladder as Deputy Chief, and Nick Nardone Sr. of Engine 1 as Battalion Chief. # North Hudson Community Action Corporation Opens Health Center in Secaucus

On January 23rd, North Hudson Community Action Corporation (NHCAC), a Federally Funded Health Center, opened its new service center at the Hudson Regional Hospital in Secaucus. The facility was officially inaugurated at a ribbon cutting ceremony led by NJ Deputy Commissioner of Health Deborah Hartel, NHCAC President and CEO Joan Quigley, Chairman Joseph Muniz, Secaucus



Councilman and NHCAC Board Member John Gerbasio and Hudson Regional Hospital President and CEO, Dr. Nizar Kifaieh. The new facility, located on the second floor of Hudson Regional Hospital, includes a reception area, waiting room, and seven patient examination rooms, including an isolation room for severely infected patients.

Speaking about the new center, Ms. Quigley noted that this one-of-a-kind collaboration between a hospital and a Federally Qualified Health Center could become a model for other centers in the country. The facility offers primary health care services, discounted medications and more. NHCAC already has a presence in other locations in the area and now brings its services closer to our Secaucus residents. # **Tenants: Are you covered?**

Are you a tenant without a renter's insurance policy? Did you consider what will happen if the contents of your unit are damaged by a water leak or fire? Or a fire displaces you and your family, leaving you to incur costs for alternate living arrangements? In such instances, your landlord's insurance policy will not cover expenses for your contents, alternate living arrangements and any liability claims. It is important that tenants consider getting a renter's insurance policy. Depending on the type of coverage, renter's insurance covers the current value of the tenant's belongings or a full replacement value. Policies may cover living expenses if the unit becomes damaged, and also liability claims for damage caused by the owner's unit that are not due to a structural problem.

Renters insurance policies are not as expensive as some may think. The benefits may outweigh costs if you ever find yourself in circumstances that could have been covered. Reach out to your insurance agent or search online for the many options available for renter's insurance.


